# Annual Report of the Activities of KKM

In the past year, Kapadwanj Kelavani Mandal (KKM) advanced its mission through impactful initiatives in education, sports, culture, social entrepreneurship and infrastructure. Over 7,300 students and several community members benefited from our initiatives. Cultural events nurtured tradition, creativity, and community spirit. Sports tournaments and sports projects promoted physical well-being and youth leadership. Campus infrastructure was strengthened through sustainable upgrades and strategic partnerships. Together, these and other efforts reflect KKM's unwavering commitment to holistic growth and social empowerment.

## Social Enterprise Incubation with Dani Foundation and NYU-Stern School of Business

Over the past two years, Kapadwanj Kelavani Mandal (KKM) has been actively collaborating with Dani Foundation and NYU Stern School of Business to drive entrepreneurship, education, and community development in Kapadwanj. This partnership has focused on empowering local entrepreneurs, fostering innovation, and strengthening business incubation models to create sustainable economic opportunities.

The project was made possible through the generous support of NYU alum Mudit Dani and Jalaj Dani, whose longstanding association with KKM has enabled meaningful interventions in education and entrepreneurship. The research conducted during this initiative has laid the foundation for pilot programs and accelerators that will help local artisans and emerging entrepreneurs thrive in the region.



### Udhyam Uday Competition & Entrepreneurial Growth

KKM organized, Udhyam Uday competition, a competition, which focuses on identifying and supporting grassroots entrepreneurs. This initiative provided local students and entrepreneurs an opportunity for mentorship and learnings from well-established entrepreneurs from Kapadwanj and beyond strengthening the entrepreneurial ecosystem in Kapadwanj.

Over 30 individuals participated over two rounds in three categories to present their entrepreneurship dreams.

The collaboration between KKM, Dani Foundation, and NYU Stern has already yielded significant results, from entrepreneurial incubation to business development strategies. As KKM continues to expand its initiatives, the next phase will focus on:

- Setting up an entrepreneurship incubation model to support more local businesses
- Strengthening partnerships with local institutions like CED and IRMA to bring innovative solutions to Kapadwanj
- Developing structured mentorship programs for emerging entrepreneurs

## Smash Barriers - ITTF Foundation Project

Over the past year, the Dream Building Fund (DBF) grant—awarded by the ITTF Foundation—has empowered KKM and DSF to drive inclusive community development through table tennis and sport-based learning.

The initiative reached 400+ children, including 29 with disabilities, across 3 communities and 12 schools. A total of 153 sports sessions and 212 educational sessions were conducted, with 100+ parents, 140+ senior citizens, and 85+ women engaged through intergenerational and gender-focused programs.

Key achievements include:

- Installation of 6 table tennis (TT) tables, with participation from 182 children in TT programs and 49 in inter-community tournaments.
- Community-led transformation in Madarivas, where a new play space was created through local collaboration.
- Introduction of digital literacy sessions for 62 children, women's literacy classes, and menstrual health awareness for 85+ women.
- Children attended national events: 12 at WTT Vadodara, 17 at UTT Ahmedabad, and 6 represented KKM at Khel Mahakumbh.
- Computer education for 67 children from the community.

The program has fostered confidence, communication, and life skills while building safe, inclusive environments and deeper trust within the communities. It marks not the end, but the beginning of a grassroots movement powered by sport.



## Our Heritage, Our Pride

Dani Foundation, a philanthropic initiative supported by the Dani family, is dedicated to building a self-sustaining and empowered society through meaningful grassroots efforts. Kapadwanj has been chosen as the focal point for the Foundation's ambitious heritage conservation and cultural tourism initiative, in partnership with KKM, which is spearheading its on-ground execution.

This initiative revolves around two core focus areas:

1. Restoring Historic Stepwells and Community Heritage Sites
2. Revitalizing Urban Heritage Through Facade Enhancements and Heritage Walks

**1. Breathing Life Back Into Stepwells and Sacred Spaces** At the heart of this heritage journey lies the restoration of Kapadwanj's architectural gems—Kund Vav, Kirti Toran, and 32 Kotha ni Vav—structures steeped in history and cultural identity. These timeless landmarks not only reflect the ingenuity of past craftsmanship but also hold deep emotional resonance for the community.

Work began in 2025 on the restoration of Kund Vav, with simultaneous efforts underway to revive the majestic 32 Kotha ni Vav through the Directorate of State Archaeology and Museums. Both projects are supported by KKM and the Dani Foundation, which are playing a critical role in mobilizing the local community, fostering stewardship, and providing operational and logistical backing. Together, these efforts aim to renew a sense of pride and cultural continuity among the people of Kapadwanj.

**2. Reimagining Streetscapes with Facade Restoration and Heritage Walks** Inspired by the transformational heritage model of Vadnagar, the second pillar of the initiative focuses on restoring building facades within carefully selected heritage zones of Kapadwanj. This endeavor seeks to recapture the town's historical aesthetic and celebrate its architectural charm, while simultaneously nurturing local identity and civic pride.

This facade revitalization will also pave the way for dedicated heritage walk pathways, designed to invite locals and travelers to experience Kapadwanj's rich legacy up close. These curated walks will promote immersive cultural tourism, stimulate the local economy, and encourage collective ownership of heritage preservation—anchoring Kapadwanj as a vibrant and sustainable cultural destination.



# Celebrating Culture, Inspiring Creativity

## Shri Shankerlal Harjivandas Shah Sanskrutik Kendra

Established in 2017 at KKM with the generous support of Shri Yogendra Shah's family, the Shri Shankerlal Harjivandas Shah Sanskrutik Kendra has become a vibrant cultural beacon for Kapadvanj Taluka. With a vision to nurture artistic expression and preserve traditional heritage, the center reaches over 2,000 students annually through integrated curriculum offerings in dance, music, visual arts, and crafts. Participation in at least one cultural activity is mandatory for primary students, ensuring that creativity is a foundational part of their growth.

KKM proudly hosts 15+ Taluka-level events of Kala Mahakumbh each year, with over 1,000 students from the region, including 250+ from KKM, competing across disciplines. Our students consistently shine, earning top prizes in nearly every category. We are also the trusted hosts of the Taluka-level Yuva Mahotsav, welcoming young talent from across the community.

The centre has annual signature events that are open to the community and reflect an inclusive, festive spirit of cultural exchange:

- Photography Competition & Seminar Sponsored by Smt. Indumati Yogendra Shah and family, this event draws entries across Kapadvanj Taluka.
- Garba Competition, this crowd-favorite gathers teams of 12–16 dancers from schools, NGOs, and neighborhoods. With several prizes and rich participation from the community, it's a spirited celebration of tradition and rhythm.
- Drawing Competition with participation from over 2500 each year across 9 schools and 6 age groups, this inclusive event sparks creativity at scale. Backed again by the Shah family, the competition awards 10,000 INR and certificates to young artists.
- Dance Competition sees 50+ participants from various schools. Winners were honored with trophies and certificates, reinforcing our commitment to expanding artistic platforms.

## Rasotsav – A Cultural Tapestry

This year KKM celebrated Rasotsav, a dynamic confluence of dance, music, and devotion. The KKM campus comes alive with traditional costumes, energetic performances, and intergenerational participation. Rasotsav beautifully encapsulates the center's ethos: honoring the past while engaging the present. Over 1200 students performed on stage over 3 days. The event was attended by over 10,000 people across the 3 days.



## Empowering Change through Sport - SFT Fellowship Program

The Sports for Transformation Fellowship, hosted at Kapadwanj Kelavani Mandal (KKM) and supported by the Dani Sports Foundation, is a two-year grassroots leadership program that places young changemakers in communities to harness the power of sport for social development. In 2025, 12 fellows at KKM led a range of high-impact initiatives focused on physical literacy, gender inclusion, and youth empowerment.

A key highlight of the year was the collaborative effort between fellows and KKM's Physical Education (PE) teachers to design and implement age-appropriate sports plans across KKM schools. These plans ensured structured physical activity tailored to different age groups, integrating local games, team sports, and fitness routines into the school timetable. This partnership not only enhanced student engagement but also built the capacity of PE staff through co-facilitated sessions and shared planning. 3000+ students at KKM benefitted from this partnership.

Fellows also organized community tournaments in frisbee, kho-kho, and football, facilitated menstrual health awareness drives, digital literacy classes, and “Chai Pe Charcha” sessions with mothers to strengthen community dialogue. Through these efforts, the fellowship nurtured youth leadership, fostered inclusive play environments, and deepened community trust in sport as a tool for transformation.

### Community Engagements:

- 255 community sessions on sports, hygiene, literacy by fellows.
- Events: Frisbee Hat Tournament (82 local + 82 others), ITTF TT program in 3 communities.
- Delhi HAT tournament: 30 children; Summer Camp across 5 communities with multi-skill focus.
- New programming in 3 areas: Harijanvas, Matria, Gopalpura.
- Monthly localized planning; TT introduced in 2 new communities.
- CWSN: 168 tailored sessions + 527 in art, exposure, and support; celebrated Special Khel Mahakumbh and other events.
- Home visits generated disability profiles; sessions tailored based on disability %.



# Education Initiatives

In pursuit of academic excellence and improved learning outcomes, KKM has undertaken a series of impactful initiatives during the year. The emphasis was placed on enhancing pedagogical techniques, fortifying teacher competencies, and systematically addressing learning gaps among students.

## 1. Teacher Training and Capacity Building

Recognizing the transformative role of well-equipped educators, KKM prioritized teacher development, reinforcing efforts from the past two years:

- A total of 18 training sessions were conducted—4 led by external experts and 14 delivered in-house—covering key areas such as learning outcomes, lesson planning, classroom delivery, and assessment design.
- An internal training team was established, comprising 2 Master Trainers, 8 Subject Trainers, and 11 Sub-Trainers, to offer continuous academic support throughout the year. Plans are in place to further elevate the capabilities of this group in the coming year.
- A structured mentorship system was introduced to support onboarding teachers. New recruits received induction training and participated in an additional 8 hours of targeted mentorship, ensuring familiarity with KKM's educational approach and values.

These structured interventions led to improved clarity, confidence, and preparedness among teachers and contributed to the standardization of academic practices across all schools.



## 2. Targeted Remedial Support

To bridge learning gaps, especially for students lagging behind, well-designed remedial programs were launched at the start of each term. During the second term, these initiatives received additional support from B.Ed. students, enhancing their reach and effectiveness.

A diagnostic system based on learning outcome-aligned assessments was implemented to identify academic shortfalls. The insights gained were used to create individualized support plans, incorporating extra practice and close monitoring.

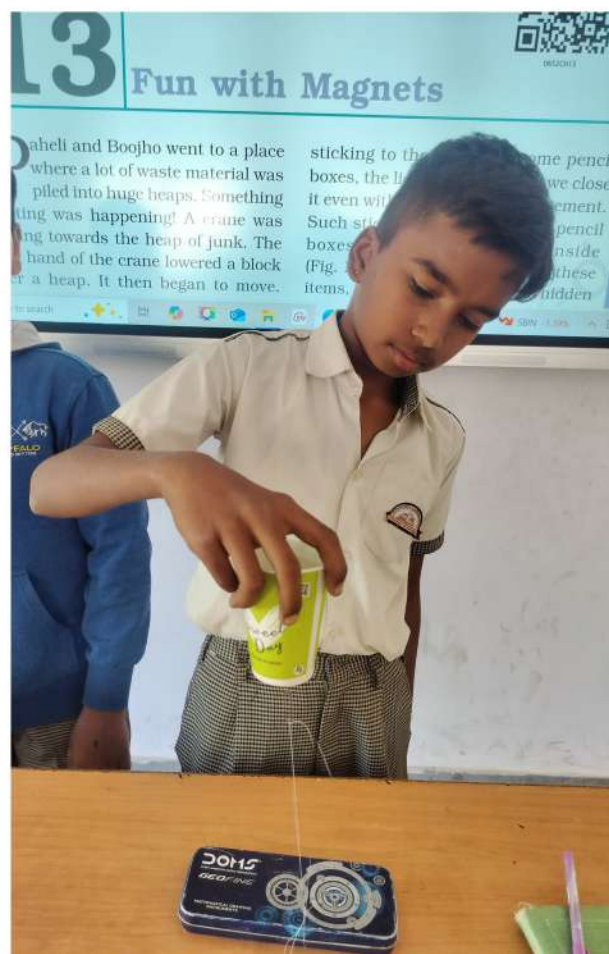
# Education Initiatives

## 3. Enhancing Classroom Teaching

- Teachers received comprehensive training on activity-based learning and effective integration of teaching-learning materials (TLMs).
- Over 494 classroom observations were conducted to provide constructive feedback and on-the-spot support.
- As a result, 60% of teachers consistently utilized TLMs and introduced creative homework practices.
- The implementation of best teaching practices saw a marked increase—from 6% adoption in the first term to 45% in the second.
- Educators were also trained in crafting high-quality assessment tools through Bloom's Taxonomy and blueprint-based frameworks, improving the rigor and relevance of student evaluations.

## 4. Innovations in Early Childhood Education

In the pre-primary section, a major highlight was the introduction of Toy-Based Pedagogy to make learning more engaging and developmentally appropriate. Teachers designed and deployed 45 unique educational toys, stimulating early conceptual understanding and creative expression among young learners.



## Chhoti Pathshala - Nurturing Young Minds, Enriching Communities

Chhoti Pathshala, an after-school educational initiative, was launched with the vision of bridging learning gaps for children living in urban slum communities. This year, it has continued to provide free, accessible, and engaging learning opportunities to children whose families face financial hardships or educational challenges.

Held during the evening hours, Chhoti Pathshala focuses on essential skills such as reading, writing, and mathematics. It also offers creative enrichment through art, drawing, and craft activities—fostering holistic development and igniting a sense of curiosity and confidence among the children.

### Key Highlights from the Year:

- **Celebration of Learning and Culture:** Special occasions like Science Day, Women's Day, Children's Day, Holi, and Dhulandi were joyfully celebrated with active participation from both children and community volunteers. These events fostered inclusion, pride, and community engagement.
- **Empowering Communities:** Local women and mothers were engaged through sessions on health and hygiene, building awareness and knowledge that benefits entire families.
- **Summer Camp Magic:** Our annual summer camp offered fun and hands-on learning in dance, sports, art, craft, and computer literacy—ensuring that children remained active, inspired, and connected during the school break.
- **Right to Education (RTE) Support:** We assisted parents in understanding their children's rights under the RTE Act and helped facilitate school admissions by providing essential information and support during the enrollment process.

### Areas Reached:

- Marwadi Vas – 31 children
- Harijan Vas – 20 children
- Gopalpura – 31 children
- Matariya Vas – 30 children

Total Beneficiaries – 112 children

Chhoti Pathshala continues to positively influence not only the children who attend but also their families and communities. Parents have become more involved in their children's education, and a shared commitment to learning is beginning to take root in each locality we serve.



## Career Counselling & Financial Literacy

Most students and parents face uncertainty when choosing a career after Class 10 or 12. To address this, we launched a structured Career Guidance Program at KKM a few years ago. We begin at Class 8, creating awareness through expert-led group sessions. Collaborations with organizations like ICAI enrich this process. Each year, around 600 students take standardized aptitude tests for informed planning. We also started a pilot financial literacy program this year.

Across both initiatives, four expert-led seminars reached 480 students across schools and colleges, in partnership with esteemed institutions. These sessions explored current job trends, essential skills, and academic pathways.

## Savita Kanti Digital Skilling Program

In collaboration with late Shri Kunjbhai Trivedi's family, KKM completed three batches of its free digital education course, training 83 women in vital tech skills.

Curriculum Highlights: MS Office, Internet usage, Canva, email writing, Paint, and computer hardware.

Impact:

- 24 women began generating income using their new digital capabilities
- Boosted digital confidence and self-reliance within the local community

## In school Sports Program

KKM along with Dani Sports for Transformation team, implemented a sports plan for its pre-primary and primary schools. The initiative was to improve physical literacy, inclusive play, and community development across schools. Through in-school programs and innovation hub the initiative engaged thousands of children in structured sports, promoted life skills, and built inclusive, participatory ecosystems.

### In-School Sports:

- 3 primary schools covered with 7 sports: Kho-kho (433), Kabaddi (225), Football (297), TT (29), Chess (53), Badminton (183), Cricket.
- Participation: 2,214 in-school; 912 (inter-school), 1,090 (Khel Mahakumbh); 1,297 in house competitions.
- 4,925 PE sessions conducted using DSF curriculum.
- Added a new govt. school (Grades 1–8); Volleyball and Tug-of-War introduced; focus on traditional games.
- Fit India Assessment for 1,201 boys and 1,050 girls.
- Academic timetable included 3–4 sports periods/week; 3 trainers hired, more PE staff in progress.
- Achievements: Block-level wins (Kabaddi, Kho-kho, Volleyball, Tug-of-War), district (Kabaddi, Badminton, Football), state (Football, Chess).

### Innovation Hub:

- 1,092 play-based pre-primary sessions for motor skill development; integrated into curriculum.
- Full implementation of DSF's FMS/GMS curriculum; monthly learning goals.



## Infrastructure Improvements

### Dani Hostel:

In their shared mission to drive holistic development in Kapadwanj, the Dani Foundation and Kapadwanj Kelavani Mandal (KKM) have partnered across diverse sectors—including Sports, Skill Development, Livelihood, Heritage Conservation, and Education. These efforts have drawn a steady stream of professionals, consultants, and staff from the Dani Foundation's Delhi and Mumbai offices to the town.

Kapadwanj also plays host to two annual student cohorts from NYU Stern School of Business, who immerse themselves in community-driven academic work as part of their global curriculum. To accommodate these visiting groups and improve the overall infrastructure that supports such engagements, a dedicated residential facility—Dani Hostel—was conceived and built.

The hostel features 24 twin-sharing rooms, along with essential amenities like a conference hall, canteen, and kitchen. It's designed to serve not only students and professionals but also to support the broader ecosystem of developmental initiatives in the region.

Dani Hostel was officially inaugurated on June 7th, 2025, in the gracious presence of Shri Jalaj Dani, Promoter of the Dani Foundation, and Shri Devusinh Chauhan, Member of Parliament from Kheda.



## Infrastructure Improvements

### Dani Colleges

Dani College of Arts & Commerce and Dani College of Science As part of its vision to enhance access to quality higher education in rural Gujarat, the Dani Foundation, in collaboration with KKM, is nearing completion of a state-of-the-art academic facility in Kapadwanj. The new G+1 structure spans 40,000 square feet, tailored to meet the evolving educational aspirations of the region.

Designed with modern pedagogy in mind, the building will house advanced science laboratories, smart classrooms, a well-stocked library, seminar hall, and comprehensive fire and safety infrastructure. This thoughtfully constructed space marks a transformative step in empowering local students and elevating academic standards.

Scheduled for inauguration in July, 2025, the facility will primarily support under graduate and postgraduate programs including B.Com & M.Com (English Medium), B.A. & M.A. (English), and M.Sc. (Chemistry). It reflects the shared commitment of KKM and the Dani Foundation to nurture future-ready, accessible education in a rural context—bridging potential with opportunity.



## Academic Institutions

### **Shree Jadavaba Shishukendra (Pre-Primary, Gujarati Medium; Est. 1966)**

A flagship of early childhood education, the institution thrives on experiential learning and cultural immersion. Highlights of the year include:

- Praveshotsav: Traditional welcome ceremony with tilak, flowers, sweets.
- Gallery Walks & Color Days: Seasonal displays and color-themed exploration.
- Festivals & Wellness: Rasotsav, sports day, health camps, and birthday celebrations.
- Parent-Teacher Meetings: 8 sessions aligning with Gujarat's NEP; ~80% parent engagement.
- Teacher Development: Workshops focused on creative thinking, feedback, and language skills.

### **Shree Spandan Balmandir (Pre-Primary, Gujarati Medium; Est. 2005)**

A nurturing and culturally enriched environment for 325 children, focusing on holistic development. Activities and achievements for the year include:

- Praveshotsav, festivals, sports festival (incl. Chhalaang Project in collaboration with DANI Foundation)
- Library activities, routine health checks, ayurvedic Suvarna Prashan, dental care
- Active parent involvement through meetings, self-governance initiatives, and functions
- Awards: 3rd & 4th in drawing competition and 1st (4th consecutive year) in Ganesh Mahotsav inter-school contests
- Infrastructure supported through ₹66,262 in donations.

### **Shree M.V. Parikh English Medium Nursery (Pre-primary, English Medium, Est. 2000)**

An English-medium nursery with a strong activity-drive and community focus:

- Experiential learning: Seasonal setups, Color Days, Rasotsav
- Skill-building: Fine/gross motor, practical life skills, yoga
